# WHAT IS A POLICY?

## Policy = Tools for Change

**Definition:** A policy is a plan or rule made by a government, institution, or organization to solve a problem or guide actions.



**Key Idea:**  
Good climate policy turns our values into action by reducing emissions, protecting nature, and improving lives.

**For example:**  
> The EU funds a transition away from coal in Poland.





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# WHY CO-DESIGN MATTERS

**Co-design** means creating policies with others, not just for them.

When young people are included, they:

- Share **fresh ideas**.
- Spot challenges others might miss.
- Bring **digital skills** and **creativity**.
- Ensure solutions are **relevant for their generation**.

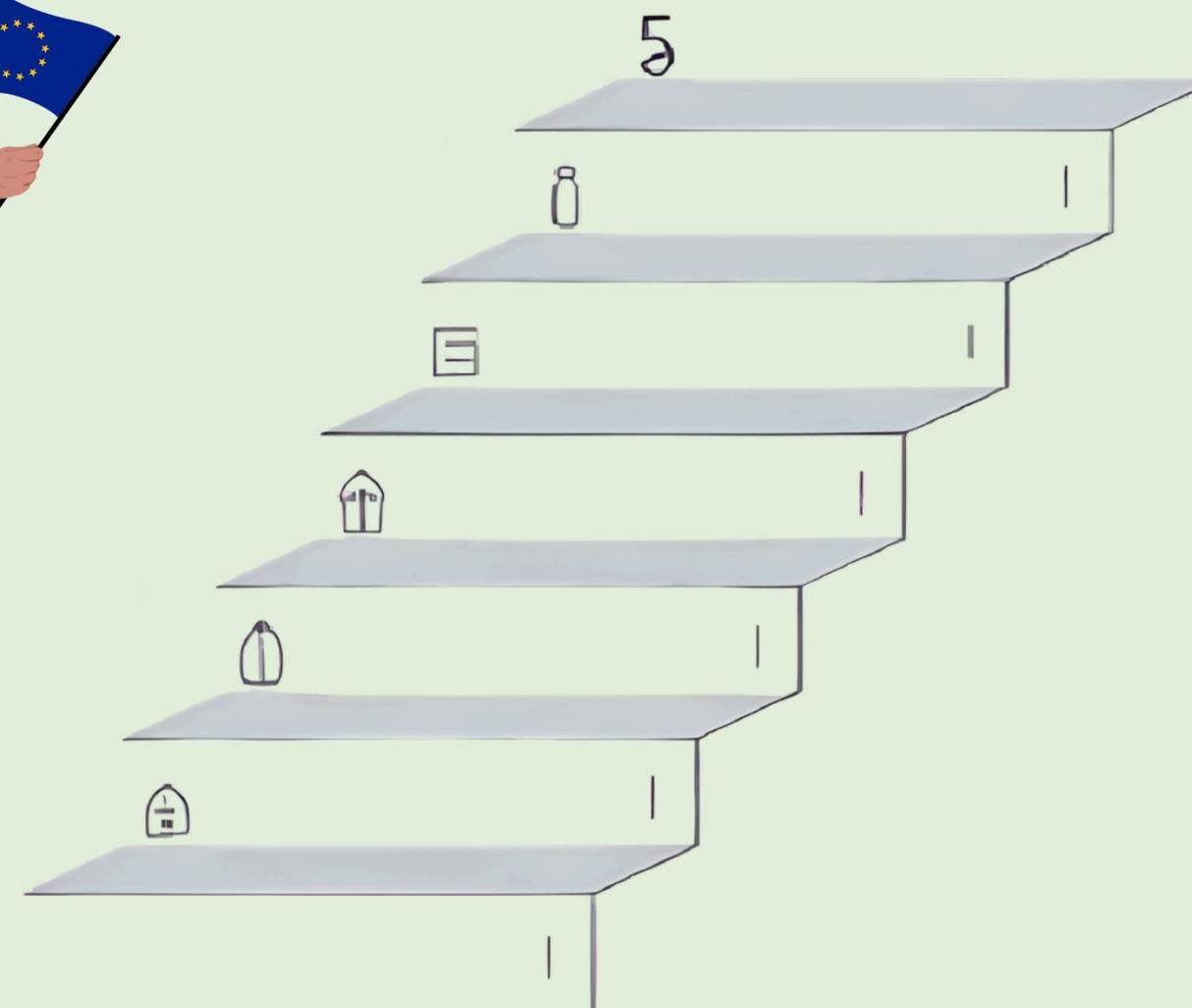
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# INTRODUCING THE POLICY PITCH PAD



## Your Launchpad for Action

The Policy Pitch Pad is a simple, step-by-step approach to create and present your own climate policy idea. It gives you the structure to speak up and be heard.





# 1 STEP 1: IDENTIFY THE PROBLEM



**What specific climate-related issue do you want to fix?**

- Be specific! A clear problem leads to a better solution.
- Example: Too much food waste at school.





## 2 STEP 2: SET YOUR GOAL

**What should your policy achieve?**

A good **goal** is:

- **Realistic:** It can actually happen.
- **Measurable:** You'll know if it worked.
- **Fair:** It helps people, not harms them.





# 3 STEP 3: PROPOSE THE SOLUTION

## What's your policy idea?

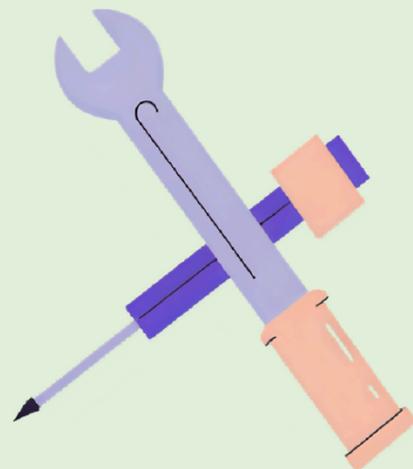
Use this format :

- **Problem:** My town has too much car pollution.
- **Goal:** Reduce car use and make public transport easier.
- **Solution:** Give free bus passes to all students and build new bike lanes.

### Your solution should match the problem and goal.

Think about:

- **Laws or rules that need to change.**
- **Funding** sources.
- Who is **responsible** for making it happen.



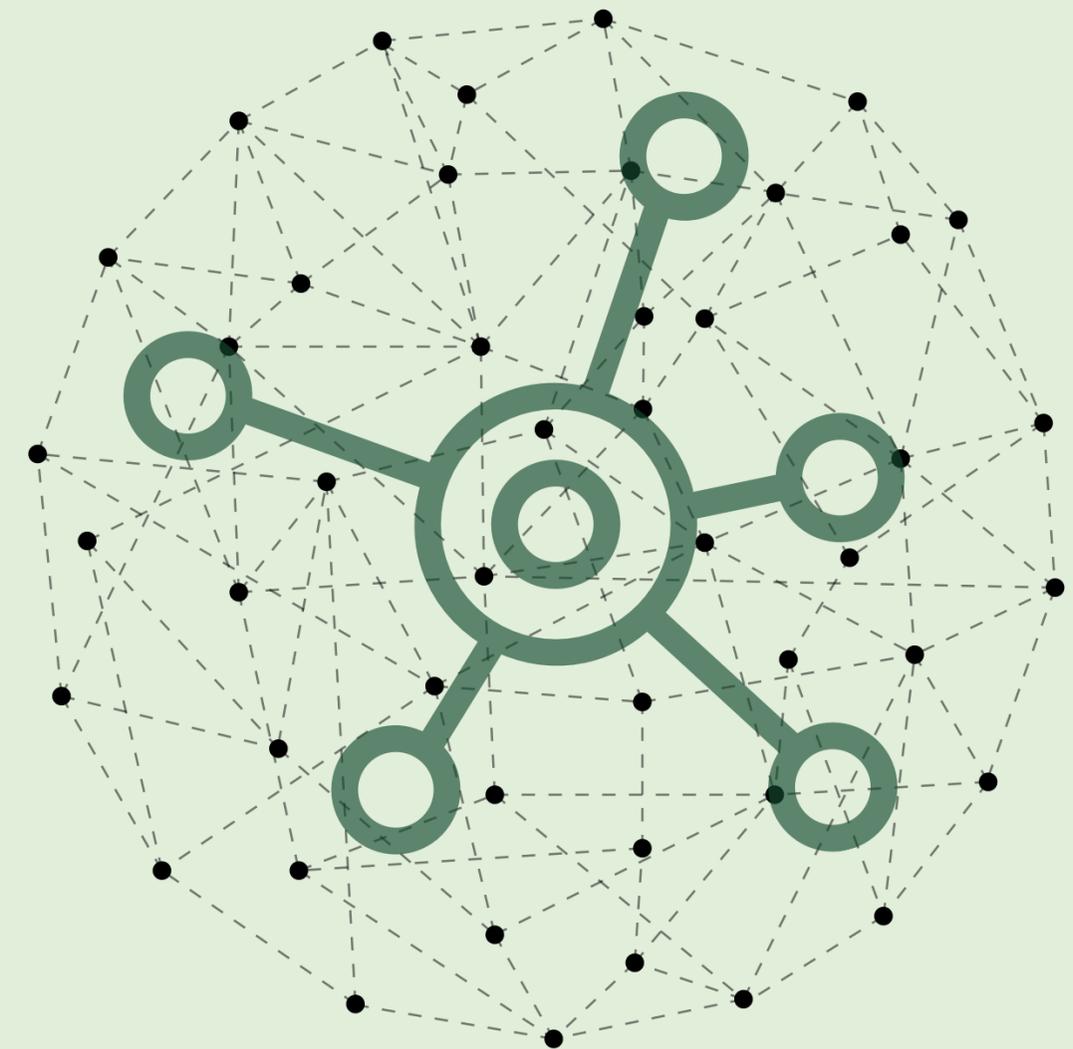


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# STEP 4: CONSIDER THE STAKEHOLDERS

**Who will support your idea? Who might resist it?**

**Good policies** balance different interests and explain why the change matters to everyone.





# STEP 5: COMMUNICATE YOUR PITCH

**How will you present your idea?**

Your **pitch** should be short, clear, and show who benefits.

- **Example** : "Our plan gives students free transport passes. It saves money, cuts emissions, and helps young people feel part of the solution"..





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# Policy Inspiration

## Types of Policy Solutions You Could Design

**You can create pitches in many areas:**

- **Energy** – community solar panels, insulation programs
- **Mobility** – safe bike paths, car-free days
- **Education** – climate classes, green school rules
- **Jobs** – training for solar, urban farming, circular economy
- **Nature** – protecting rivers, planting trees
- **Housing** – sustainable building rules, rent support for energy-efficient homes

**> The key is to think locally but connect globally**



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# Don't Forget Ethics!

**Great Policy is Smart and Just**

**Every solution affects people differently.**

**Always ask:**

- Who might be left out?
- Does this help those most affected by climate change?
- Is this fair for future generations?

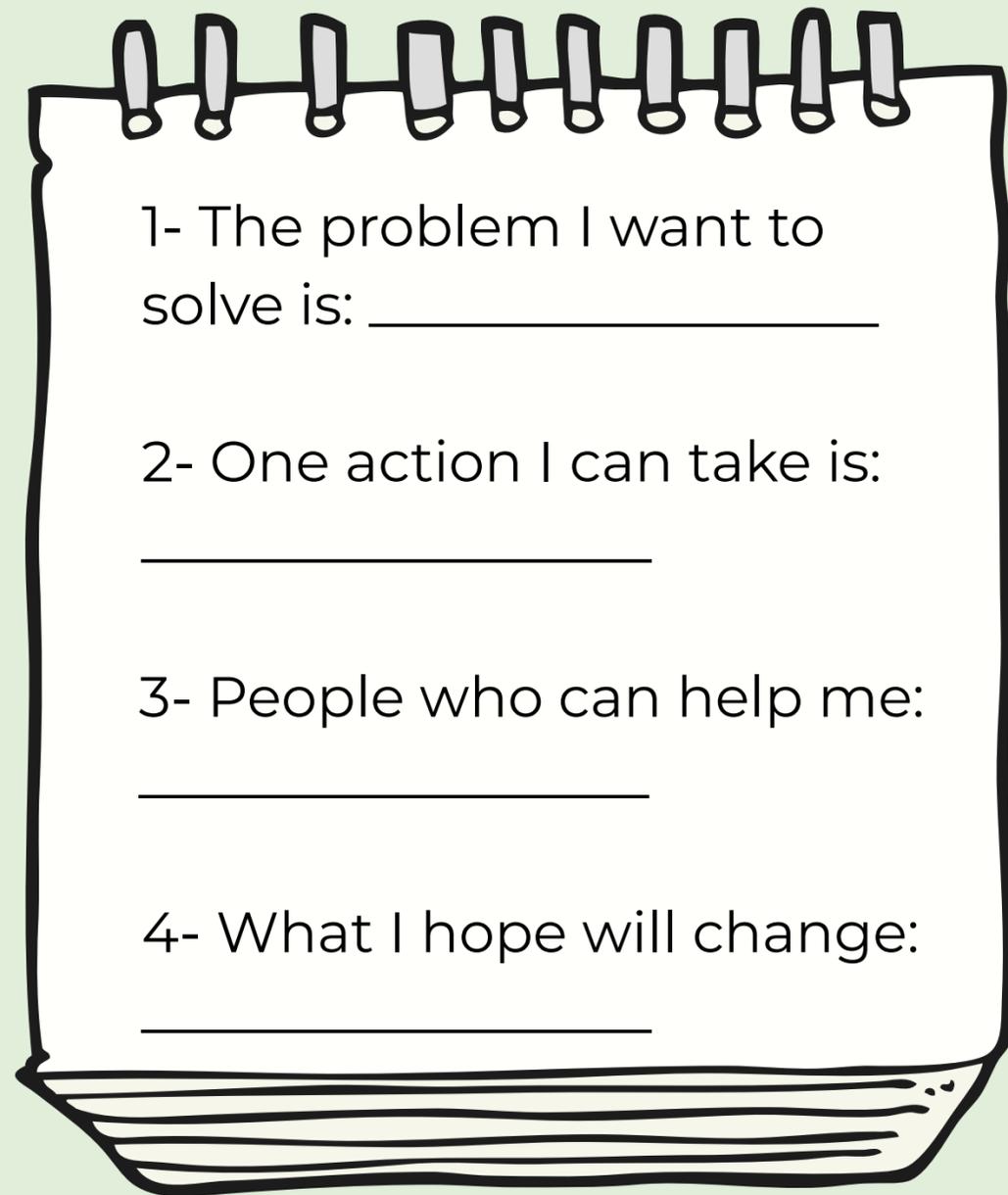
